

Real Life Christian Church Discussion Guide Jeff Wallace | July 28, 2024

Main Idea: Jeff Wallace continues the series called, Real Faith! This sermon emphasizes the importance and impact of having a Godly community and faith-filled friends, illustrating how such relationships facilitate life-changing experiences, as demonstrated by the story of friends bringing a paralyzed man to Jesus in Mark 2:3-11.

Start Talking: Find a conversation starter for your group. (Choose one)

- Has it been easy to find friends who are following Jesus?
- Who is one of your closest friends, tell us about them!

Start Thinking: Ask questions to get your group thinking.

- What qualities do you think are essential in a Godly community?
- How does the story in Mark 2:3-11 illustrate the importance of having a strong, faith-based community?
- What obstacles might prevent us from building and maintaining a Godly community?

Start Sharing: Choose a question to create openness.

- How have faith-filled friends made a difference in your spiritual journey?
- What role do you think suronding yourself in a Godly community plays in deepening your relationship with God?
- Did the story of the friends bringing the paralyzed man to Jesus challenge your perspective on friendship? How so?
- Can you share a positive experience you've had with a friend that has strengthened your faith?

Start Doing: Commit to taking the Next Step and living it out.

- What are your hopes for your Christ centered friendships?
- What steps can we take to build a stronger Godly community within our circle of influence?
- What personal changes can you make to be a more supportive, faith-filled friend?

Start Praying: Close your time together in prayer. Be bold and pray with power.

The Leader should close in prayer for the first session or two. Think about inviting other Group Members to lead a
prayer for the group in future sessions. Connect your prayer to the main idea of the message and pray for your
group members that have made a next step commitment to living this out.
